# National Dental Hygiene Job Market and Employment Survey 2009

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### **Executive Summary**

The Canadian Dental Hygienists Association conducted its fourth national survey during October 2009. The data collected by these surveys has provided CDHA members with valuable information for salary and benefits negotiations as well as career planning. Topics covered by the survey include education, employment conditions, occupational health issues, future career interests, among others. Through these surveys the CDHA monitors trends in provincial and regional indicators, providing advice to the board and members. Results are distributed for public information and promotion of the dental hygiene profession.

The survey was conducted on the web beginning October 1 and ending October 31, 2009. Members of the CDHA were invited to participate in a variety of ways. CDHA provided members with survey information through our regular e-mail broadcasts. In addition, each dental hygiene provincial association was sent a notice identifying the study objectives and the web link and were asked to communicate this information to their members either by newsletter, direct email or other notice about the study.

An impressive total of 3,151 (20%) responses were received. The entire active membership of 11,738 received e-mail notices. It is noteworthy that 3,600 members of RÉSO-HD-QUÉBEC were also invited to participate. These data gave us an interval of +/- 1.49% at the 95% confidence level.

# Highlights

The younger age groups are notably larger compared with the responding group for 2006, when those aged 20 to 29 represented almost 11% compared to this survey showing that age group as 28%.

The surveys completed by Quebec respondents were the largest group representing 37% of responses, followed by Ontario respondents (26%) and then those residing in British Columbia (17%). In the 2006 study British Columbia yielded the majority of responses (52%), whereas Ontario represented less than half that number of respondents (20%). Slightly more than a third (34%) of respondents completed the survey in French.

The responses indicate that 736 of the dental hygienists (15%) had a dental assisting certificate upon entry to dental hygiene education, with the majority having a broader range of credentials. There were 361 bachelor degrees reported by the 3,151 respondents.

The average hourly wage reported across all positions held as employees was \$36.47 per hour, which is lower than the average \$39.00 per hour wage reported in the 2006 study. The lowest wages were \$27.08 reported for Québec jobs, being approximately half the Alberta rate of pay. The high participation of Québec dental hygienists, compared to previous years, caused the lower overall reported average hourly wage in this study.

While 66% of respondents indicated that they had only one workplace, there were 13% who had reported having two jobs, and the remaining 21% held a variety of jobs. While there were 20% of dental hygienists responded that they were seeking more hours of work, 75% of respondents are satisfied with their number or work hours. However, in the 2006 study 6% of respondents were seeking more hours and 86% were satisfied with the number of work hours.

A large number of dental hygienists representing 44% indicated they have searched for new employment in dental hygiene in the past two years. In the 2006 survey there were 31% of respondents who had searched for employment in the two years previous to the survey.



# 1. In which of the following age brackets do you belong?

The national study of dental hygienist indicated that there are roughly 4 large age groups similar in size. The largest age group was reported as those respondents between 25 and 29 years of age. Each five year group older than that is a similar size, up to those ages 40 to 44. The younger age groups are notably larger compared with the responding group for 2006, when those aged 20 to 29 represented almost 11% compared to this survey showing that age group as 28%.

# 2. Please indicate your gender.



As expected, male dental hygienists were a very small proportion; only 2.5% of survey participants indicated being male. However, this is an increase from the previous labour surveys 2002 at 1.4% and 2004 at 1.1%





Respondents were asked which languages they speak fluently. The greatest proportion indicated that 72% of respondents were fluent in English, with 42% who responded that they were fluent in French and only less than half a percent were fluent in an aboriginal language. There were 34% of the surveys completed in the French language.

The surveys completed by respondents residing in Quebec were the largest group representing 37% of responses, followed by Ontario residents (26%) and then those residing in British Columbia (17%). In the previous study British Columbia yielded the majority of responses (52%) whereas Ontario represented less than half that number of respondents (20%).

While the CDHA has only 173 members living in Quebec, the notification to participate was distributed to 3,427 members of RÉSO-HD-QUÉBEC who were not members of this national association.

Respondents indicated places of work that included 38% of the jobs were located within the largest metropolitan centres represented by Vancouver, Calgary, Edmonton, Toronto, Ottawa, Montreal and Quebec City. There were 64% of dental hygienists residing outside of these metropolitan centres, whereas 62% of the reported dental hygienists jobs were outside these metropolitan areas.

While 66% of respondents indicated that they had only one workplace, there were 13% who had reported having two jobs, and the remaining 3% held a variety of jobs. The 2004 and 2006 CDHA labour surveys indicated 64% and 63% respectively of respondents that had one workplace.

# 6. How many years have you been practicing dental hygiene?

Most dental hygienists have been practicing for 5 years or less. There were 38% of the respondents who indicated 5 years of practice or less compared with 21% in 2006. The proportion of responses from each remaining response category is less, by as much as 6% as a result.



# 7. For how many more years do you intend to practice dental hygiene?

Almost 33% responded that they intended to practice for up to 10 years. Almost 30% intend to practice more than 20 years. More respondents indicated that they intended to practice more years than they did in the 2006 study, where 20% indicated that they would practice for more than 20 years.

8. Please indicate the provinces in which you are currently licensed or registered as a dental hygienist.



The largest category of respondents indicated that 28% were licensed in Quebec, with the next largest group being almost 23% having their province of license holders in Ontario, followed by British Columbia. There were 37% of respondents who indicated that they lived in Quebec. While there are only 173 of CDHA members who live in Quebec, the members of the Quebec association, RÉSO-HD-QUÉBEC, participated in the survey in very large numbers, as noted above.

Roughly an equal number of respondents reported having graduated with either a 2 year diploma or a 3 year diploma, with only 3% having completed a Bachelors Degree in dental hygiene.

During their years of dental hygiene practice many respondents indicated that they have completed a dental hygiene program leading to a certificate (10%), 2 year diploma (32%) or three year diploma (35%). Further studies should clarify the definition of a certificate, in case there is a possibility that the question was not well understood.

Currently there were many of the dental hygienists enrolled in an academic education program. Of those 244 responding, 27% indicated that they are seeking a bachelor degree in dental hygiene. A similar percent of respondents indicated their study would lead to certification at a range of levels in the field of Education, ranging from a certificate to a Doctorate degree.

While the number of enrolled dental hygienists represent 8% of respondents as reported in the previous question, there are a large number (38%) responding to this question who are interested in pursuing education in the future with the greatest focus of study targeted by 28% of respondents as a bachelor in dental hygiene. As in the previous question a good interest is shown across levels of certification in the field of Education.



## 14. What delivery method do you prefer for your education?

While 47% of respondents indicated a preference for the traditional on-campus education programs, the remaining respondents were almost equally split between a preference for on-line education and not having either preference for the delivery format.

15. If you are NOT currently practicing as a dental hygienist, please indicate the reason(s) why.



The main reason cited by 40% of respondents for not practicing dental hygiene is that they could not find a position in the area where they live. A similar size group representing 33% of respondents were not practicing due to family obligations. A total of 335 dental hygienists reported the reason that they were not currently practicing.

16. If you are currently practicing as a dental hygienist, please indicate the setting(s) in which you practice.



#### **Overall**



There were 83% of respondents who indicated they currently practice in a dental office, compared with 95% in the 2006 study and more consistent with the 85% of similar responses from the 2004 study.



Respondents with a second workplace indicated that 77% of respondents practiced in a dental office. Another 8% responded that they worked in an educational institution and 6 % worked in a dental hygiene office.



Of the group who indicated having a third workplace, 74% of respondents reported that they worked in a dental office, 7% worked in an educational institution, and 6% worked in a dental hygiene office.



In the case where there was a fourth workplace, 67% of respondents worked in a dental office, 15% worked in a dental hygiene office, and 7% worked in a long term care facility.

Workplace 1

For those dental hygienists who described their first workplace, 82% of respondents were nonunionized, 9% were unionized, and 7% worked as an independent contractor.



The dental hygienists described their positions at their second workplace by indicating that 71% of respondents were non-unionized, 8% of respondents were unionized, and 18% of respondents worked as an independent contractor.



The dental hygienists described the position they held at their third workplace by indicating that 60% were non-unionized, 6% were unionized, and 29% worked as an independent contractor.



The dental hygienists described the position that they held at their fourth workplace by indicating that 52% of respondents were non-unionized, 31% were independent contractors, and 14% were owners of a dental hygiene clinic.

#### Work conditions/quality of office supplies & equipment



Of all the factors influencing a decision on accepting employment, the top ranked was appropriate infection control, which was indicated as very important by 88% of the respondents. Adequate and skilled staff was indicated by 72% of respondents to be the next highest priority, virtually matching employer and staff rapport. Work conditions and hours of work were cited as higher priorities than wages, which were the 6th ranked priority, having a very high importance indicated by 52% of respondents.

19. Do you have decision making authority or are you consulted when ordering supplies and/or equipment?



There were 78% of respondents who reported that they have either decision making authority or that they are consulted on ordering of supplies and equipment.

20. Please indicate how many hours per week you are TYPICALLY practicing as a dental hygienist at your work places.



At the first workplace the hours of work typically reported by dental hygienists in practice were between 31 and 35 hours per week for 30% of respondents. The longer hours of work at the first workplace were reported to be 36 hours or greater by 16% of respondents.



At the second workplace, 46% of respondents indicated that they worked between 5 and 10 hours, with 19% of respondents who reported working only up to 4 hours each week. The longer hours reported to be worked at the second workplace were 11 hours or greater by 35% of respondents.



For those dental hygienists who reported working at their third workplace, there were 43% of respondents who worked up to 4 hours and 42% who indicated that they worked more than 4 but less than 11 hours per week.



For those dental hygienists who reported working at their fourth workplace, there were 58% of respondents who worked up to 4 hours and 35% who indicated that they worked more than 4 but less than 11 hours per week.

While there were 20% of dental hygienists responded that they were seeking more hours of work, 75% of respondents are satisfied with their number or work hours. However, in the 2006 study 6% of respondents were seeking more hours and 86% were satisfied with the number of work hours.

The average hourly wage reported across all positions held as employees was \$36.47 per hour, which is lower than the average wage of \$ 39.00 per hour reported in the 2006 study. Higher wages were reported by those dental hygienists holding more than one job. Overall the best compensation was reported by respondents with jobs in Alberta, where average wages were \$53.88 per hour. The lowest wages were \$27.08 reported for Quebec jobs, being approximately half the Alberta rate of pay. The high participation of Quebec respondents, compared with previous years, caused the lower reduced overall reported average hourly wage in this study. In the 2006 study the highest wages reported were by respondents holding jobs in the Northwest Territories & Nunavut at \$50.00 per hour.

The first workplace was reported by more than 50% of respondents to have a combination of benefits that include vacation/holidays/sick leave. The better compensated positions reported by dental hygienists with more than one workplace included benefits, but positions with benefits were a much smaller proportion than for the first workplace.

25. Have you searched for new employment in a dental or dental hygiene practice in the past 2 years?



A total of 335 dental hygienist reported the reason that they were not currently practicing. A large number of dental hygienists representing 44% indicated they have searched for new employment in dental hygiene in the past two years. In the 2006 survey there were 31% of respondents who had searched for employment in the two years previous to the survey.

26. If you indicated "yes" to the question above, please indicate which statement best represents your experience.



While 31.4% of dental hygienists seeking new employment reported that it was possible to find satisfactory work, 24% of respondents indicated that it was difficult to find work, and 14% indicated that they were unable to find work.

27. Are you actively seeking to practice within the dental hygiene profession outside the traditional dental office setting?



Respondents indicated that 19% were actively seeking employment outside the traditional dental office. This is notably higher than the more than 7% of the 2006 respondents seeking this type of employment. In the 2004 survey less than 5% were seeking employment outside the traditional office setting.



### 28. If YES, please indicate the area(s) in which you are currently seeking to practice.

For those dental hygienists seeking employment outside the dental office setting, the primary objective continues to be education (49.8%) and community (41.4%), and government (37.6%). In the 2006 survey these response categories were 58.5%, 39.2% and 28.1% respectively. A large group representing 27% of those seeking employment outside the dental office would like to establish their own practice.

There were 452 dental hygienists who responded that they were thinking about establishing an independent dental hygiene practice in the future. The expected future time would be more than five years for 54% of respondents

## If no, please indicate why not.



Answers given for why dental hygienists were not thinking of opening an independent practice included 32% of respondents who would prefer the financial stability of being an employee and almost 11% of respondents for whom business education was insufficient.

Of all the medical issues affecting work, the most cited type of injury was a shoulder injury/tendonitis (24%), followed by neck injury (17%) and thirdly back/spinal injury (14%).

**31.** If yes, has the injury / medical issue affected your overall ability to work in dental hygiene?



Of those 1174 dental hygienists who reported having medical issues, 47% of respondents indicated that this issue affected their overall ability to work in dental hygiene.

## 32. If yes, please describe the effect(s) of your injury / medical issue on your work.



The effect of medical issues was reported by dental hygienists to include: chronic pain (22%), shorter work hours (17%), and the use of medication to control the problem (14%).

Although 59% of respondents did not participate in volunteer activities related to dental hygiene, 22% of respondents volunteered up to 5 hours, and 7% of respondents volunteered between 6 and 10 hours.

Volunteered dental hygiene services were reported primarily in the school system by 34% of respondents.

Respondents indicated their greatest importance among all the goals cited by the Association was for workplace wellbeing, with 67% of respondents who indicated this was very important.
